2	Is it eligible within this Call for proposals, in accordance with the "Development of durable housing solutions" action, to purchase old houses in villages and adapt them for residential living of one or more Roma families per house, depending on the size of the house?	Please note, that according to the Guidelines for Applicants, Section 2.1.5, Ineligible costs amongst others, are: "purchases of land or buildings, except where necessary for the direct implementation of the action, in which case ownership must be transferred in accordance with Article 7.5 of the General Conditions of the standard grant contract, at the latest at the end of the action". In case of purchase of land or buildings the eligibility/necessity of such purchase will be estimated during the evaluation phase.

	b) What kind of purchase of equipment/supply is allowed?	b) As defined in the Guidelines for Applicants, Section 2.1.4: "Types of

7	Could a state-owned enterprise, such as Srbijavode, be a co-applicant for the call for proposals "Durable housing solutions and physical infrastructure improvements in Roma settlements"?	 Please note that according to the provision of the section 2.2.4 of the Guidelines for grant applicants: <i>"To ensure equal treatment of applicants, the contracting authority cannot give a prior opinion on the eligibility of lead applicants, co-applicants, affiliated entity(ies), an action or specific activities."</i> For further explanation, please refer to the Section 2.1.1 of the Guidelines for grant applicants, Eligibility of applicants (i.e. lead applicant and co-applicant(s)), and part related to the Co-applicant(s). Also, please note that according to provisions of PRAG, Section 6.5.8.5, Eligibility checks: <i>"the evaluation committee can check and then exclude applicants at any stage of the evaluation."</i>
8	If it is eligible to propose action that is planning to cover activities in two or more local self-governments under one project proposal?	An action might consist of one or more eligible activities. When planning/proposing the action, the applicants should ensure that objectives of the Call for Proposals are closely followed and that eligibility criteria are respected (eligibility of actions, applicants and costs).
