In order to verify the references requested we kindly ask you to confirm if, as per the technical requirements: 1) the MBT plant and the MRF can be in the same plant 2) that for the technical references there are no timing and quantities limits	LOT 1 1) MBT and MRF facilities can be part of the same plant, provided that the contract reference includes both components as required under Section 12.2.2(c) of the Instructions to Tenderers. 2) As stated in Section 12.2.2, the works must have been completed at

For the quantities limits, if you are referring to "Tenderer must have completed as the Lead Partner of the Joint Venture/Consortium or Joint Venture/Consortium Member at least 1 (one) contract which includes design and construction of sanitary landfill for non-hazardous waste with a minimum 600,000 m³ landfilling capacity, under FIDIC Condition of Contract or similar conditions of contract (International Financial Institutions - IFIs or national legislation of EU member state)," then yes, a specific quantitative (capacity) requirement is clearly defined for that reference.</p>

Therefore, this requirement cannot be fulfilled by submitting two separate contract references, each covering only one of the required components.</p>

Please refer to Section 11.2 of the Instructions to Tenderers (ITT) which states:</p> <p>“The tenderer may submit a tender for one lot only or all of the lots“.</p> <p>Please also refer to Section 4 of the Instructions to Tenderers (ITT) – “Only one tender per tenderer”, which states:</p> <p>“A company may not tender for a given contract both individually and as a member of a joint venture/consortium. Participation by a tenderer in more than one tender for a contract will result in the disqualification of all those tenders for that contract in which the party is involved. The same company may only participate as subcontractor in different tenders if that is justified by the specific nature of the market and cleared by the contracting authority.”</p>
